


COME MEET DONALD LOSPINUSO

Since its publication in 1908 G. K. Chesterton's *The Man Who Was Thursday* has thrilled, entertained, delighted, puzzled and perplexed countless readers. This talk will look at whether the book is a detective novel? A theological treatise? a political thriller? a prayer book? or all of these?



DONALD LOSPINUSO'S BIO

Donald Lospinuso is an independent scholar residing in Huntington, New York. He holds degrees from Fordham University, SUNY at Downstate and Columbia University. He has been a Pediatric NP since 1987, and is a Professor at Adelphi University. He has written on philosophical and theological subjects. His paper on G.K. Chesterton's novel, *The Man Who Was Thursday*, was published in the Chesterton Review (Volume 41 Spring/Summer 2015) and has been called by renowned reviewers and Chesterton scholars: "groundbreaking", "brilliant", "fascinating", "magnificent" and "learned." By chronicling the adventures of a secret agent infiltrating a band of anarchists bent on world domination, Chesterton's novel climbs to dizzying heights of invention and probes the deepest roots of theology. Our speaker, in the tradition of the Patriarch Joseph and the Prophet Daniel, will explicate this apparently inscrutable book. In order to accompany him on this expedition into Chesterton's beloved nightmare, we recommend that you carry a backpack stocked with philosophical provisions, don the elegant attire of imagination, wear the sturdy shoes of diligence—and don't forget to bring your thinking cap.
